Personal, Social, Health, and Economic education updates



New resources

available from PSHE Association

There have been a couple of new resources to hit since our last bulletin in September, so we thought that a bit more signposting was in order.Remember, these are only available to PSHE Association members – but if you aren't a member yet, then why not?! Hyperlinks included below.

Developing learning skills: Helping students thrive in a new key stage (KS3 & 4)

A new lesson pack to help students manage the transition to secondary school (KS3) and KS4.Contains two KS3 lessons and one KS4 lesson, covering themes like identifying values and setting clear goals, strategies to succeed and how to self-evaluate.

Personal identity lesson pack (KS1 & 2)

These two lessons (one for KS1 and another for KS2) help pupils explore the physical and abstract aspects of identity, supporting them to learn about the range of factors that contribute to personal identity and develop the skills to recognise positive aspects of their own identity. They will also help schools to hit relevant statutory Health Education outcomes – winner!

Firework safety lesson pack (KS2 & 3)

A timely couple of lessons and resources on fireworks, risk and peer influence.

The KS2 lesson focuses on assessing and managing risks around fireworks, bonfires and sparklers. The KS3 lesson explores personal safety, managing risk around fireworks and bonfires, and the law regarding the use of fireworks.

Changing and growing up KS1-2 lesson packs

You may be familiar with the previous versions of these lessons, developed by the Association for Medway Public Health Directorate. The new version is a fully updated and expanded suite of Relationships and Health Education materials for primary settings.

There are 13 lesson plans available in total, supporting pupils to recognise and develop positive, healthy relationships. They also prepare them for the physical and emotional changes that take place as they grow, including those that happen during puberty. A great free addition to any schools PSHE curriculum, these again hit multiple statutory requirements, and an additional sex education lesson for Year 6.

These new materials also sit alongside the existing set of KS3 & 4 resources from Medway that are also available via the PSHE Association.

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Anti-Bullying Week 2022 Reminder



As if you needed it, a quick reminder that annual Anti-Bullying Week is coming up very soon! This year, it will take place from 14 to 18 November 2022 and has the theme 'Reach Out'.

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The theme came about following consultation by the Anti-Bullying Alliance with teachers and pupils, who wanted a theme that empowered them to do something positive to counter the harm and hurt that bullying causes – hence Reach Out!

Talk Relationships from the NSPCC

Talk Relationships is a new, free service from the NSPCC to ensure that secondary schoolaged children and young people can learn about sex and relationships in a safe education environment that fosters healthy relationships and recognises, responds to, and prevents abuse. In order to achieve this, NSPCC Learning has put together a great package of support providing resources, training and advice aimed at secondary-phase settings.

The Talk Relationships service offer includes:

- A CPD-certified elearning course to support secondary school educators to feel confident when delivering sex and relationships education and responding to abusive behaviours
- a series of 14 lesson plans created by sex and relationships education experts from the PSHE Association and the NSPCC
- a dedicated Talk Relationships helpline to provide advice and guidance to secondary school educators who deliver sex education around things like
 - how to respond to questions or concerns from students, parents or carers
 - preparing a response to questions you think you may be asked
 - managing a safeguarding concern or disclosure
 - managing anxieties about delivering sex and relationships education

The launch of Talk Relationships comes following a pilot of the resources in 101 secondary schools. In feedback to the NSPCC, 82% of teachers said the materials had made a difference to their professional practice.

Survey says 46% of secondary teachers 'don't feel confident' delivering RSE

'In an amazing coincidence to the launch of the Talk Relationships materials, a recent joint survey from the NASUWT and NSPCC found that of 1,034 secondary school teachers in the UK, almost half of secondary school teachers say they don't feel confident teaching sex and relationships education.



This is no surprise, as many teachers from either phase will reflect on the fact that they have not had much in the way of training either in their initial teacher training, or to help once qualified in delivering much of what is covered in PSHE education, especially RSE-based learning. This is obviously important, especially as we now have statutory status, and as PSHE is definitely one of those subjects where ill informed or inaccurate teaching can potentially cause more harm than good! The great news is that there are some excellent materials and providers out there to support schools (the NSPCC Learning offer to support the Talking Relationships resource being one of them).

Our own current training programme has a number of course that can support colleagues around some of the themes highlighted in this survey, and in delivering RSE-based learning. Please check these out in our training calendar further down this edition.

NEW CLASSROOM WELLBEING TOOLKIT

Regular readers of our bulletins will know that we are die-hard fans of the Anna Freud Centre, the world-leading charity! health mental Well, in with the Early partnership Intervention Foundation (EIF), they have just created a new evidencebased toolkit for secondary school staff to improve students' mental health and wellbeing through simple everyday practices.



The toolkit has been informed by the latest evidence on what works and was designed with both teachers and young people to ensure that it reflects the reality of school life and the wider social context. The aim is that a wide range of staff can pick up the toolkit, read about effective strategies, and take steps to improve students' mental health and wellbeing – without the need to be mental health professionals.



This resource will help build staff confidence in supporting students, by covering five strategy areas:

- building supportive relationships
- creating a classroom environment where all students feel they belong
- promoting good mental health
- responding to stress, low mood and anxiety
- preventing bullying, cyberbullying and sexual harassment

Our popular professional development training sessions run throughout the academic year, with courses offered across a range of themes related to PSHE education. A variety of introductory Governor-specific training sessions are also available, aimed at raising awareness around health and wellbeing themes, such as RSE, Health Education, Substances and Mental Health and Emotional Wellbeing. These can be delivered both virtually and in school to Governors to make them as accessible as possible.
